Bishop Gadsden Coronavirus (COVID-19) Statistics

As of October 12, 2020

COVID-19 Testing Statistics:

As communicated, last week, we did have three new positive COVID-19 team member cases. Two were in non-health care culinary, and one in Myers Hall health care. All team members working in the areas of these cases are being tested twice weekly for two weeks, and we have had no new positives since last Thursday.

Due to our current test protocols, these positive cases were caught very quickly, and Bishop Gadsden was able to react in an effective and timely manner. We continue to test all employees in our health care areas twice a week and all others weekly or bi-weekly, depending on their job duties/relationship to our health care areas.

**An active case includes an individual diagnosed with COVID within the last 10 days, or an individual who continues to have COVID related symptoms more than 10 days beyond the diagnosis date.*

For Monday, October 5 through Sunday, October 10, 2020, the Charleston County percent positive is 6.5%. For that same period of time, Bishop Gadsden's percent positive is .43%, based off an average of 700 tests in that same period of time.

Myers Hall: As we reported last week, all Myers Hall residents were tested on Monday, October 5 in the aftermath of our positive Myers Hall health care team member, and all tests were negative. Those with direct exposure also received a rapid test on Thursday, October 8, and all were negative. All residents were once again tested today, Monday, October 12.

Myers Hall residents are able to move about Myers Hall; however, group gatherings, spa visits, and outdoor visits are paused until results from today's tests are available. If all tests are negative, and we have no additional positive COVID tests results in our health care areas, we will resume outdoor visits, spa activities, and gatherings on Monday, October 19.

Additionally, as noted last Thursday, we are looking forward to communicating our in-person visit program later this week.
