## Bishop Gadsden Coronavirus (COVID-19) Statistics

*As of February 1, 2021*

Today we report our first positive COVID-19 test in more than week. A non-health care team member tested today, they last worked today, are asymptomatic and last tested negative last Monday, January 25.

Last Tuesday, we held our fourth successful clinic, where all eligible health care residents and more than 100 health care team members received their second COVID-19 vaccine. Tomorrow, February 2, we look forward to our vaccine partner, CVS, administering the second dose to more than 420 apartment and cottage residents and team members. With additional clinics scheduled in the coming weeks, our focus continues to be on having 100% of eligible residents and team members receiving both of their vaccine doses.

For the week of January 25 – January 29, Bishop Gadsden conducted 652 tests. Of those that were tested at Bishop Gadsden, we had zero positive tests, giving us a percent positive rate of 0%.

According to data on the SCDHEC site for Monday, January 25 – Friday, January 29, the state of South Carolina had a percent positive rate of 25.3%, and the County of Charleston of 23.4%, according to SCDHEC website – <https://scdhec.gov/covid19/south-carolina-county-level-data-covid-19>
